

### Fire Chief's Column Chief James Sanford

WHAT TO DO WHEN SELLING YOUR HOME

Fire Code, NJAC 5:70-2.3 states "before any one or

two family dwelling is sold, leased, or otherwise made subject to a change of occupancy for residential purposes, the owner shall obtain a certificate of smoke detector, carbon monoxide alarm and fire extinguisher, evidencing compliance with NJAC 5:70-4.19".

The application can be picked up at the Building Department located in the Municipal Annex at 20 North Trivett Avenue, between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. The inspection fee is \$50.00. Once the application is filed, the Building Department will check to make sure there are no open building permits. If there are any open permits these must be closed out before the inspection can be done. Inspections are done Monday through Thursday between 8:00 and 10:00 am. Placement of the detectors shall be as follows:

At least one smoke detector shall be located on each level of the home including basements and finished attics. Crawl spaces do not require detectors.

Basement - At the bottom of the stairs to the first floor

First Floor - At the bottom of the stairs to the second floor, and within ten feet of any bedrooms

The New Jersey Uniform Second Floor - At the top of the stairs from the first floor, and within ten feet of any bedrooms

> Third Floor - At the top of the stairs from the second floor, and within ten feet of any bedrooms

> Carbon monoxide alarms are required within ten (10) feet of each sleeping area. Plug in type carbon monoxide detectors are permitted as long as the outlet is in the hallway. They cannot be plugged into outlets in the bedroom, bathroom, or kitchen.

> Battery operated smoke detectors are permitted. However, you cannot reduce any existing or required protection. For example, if the home has 110 volt interconnected smoke alarms or a hardwired central station type system that are not working; you must repair the system instead of installing a battery operated smoke detector. All detectors must be permanently secured to the ceiling or wall in accordance with the manufacturers installation guide. Double stick tape is not an acceptable method.

> An ABC type fire extinguisher is required to be permanently mounted in plain sight within the kitchen. All fire extinguishers must be new or inspected and tagged by a New Jersey licensed fire extinguisher contractor.

### Police Chief's Column Chief William Chisholm

One of the state's newer the motor vehicle. (39:4-97.3) motor vehicle laws went into effect May 1, 2008 and initially there appeared to

be a concerted effort by many motorists to comply with the conditions set forth in the law. Lately, if you observe some of your fellow motorists you might see a return to old ways. Perhaps, even you have begun to ignore the law due to living a high stress lifestyle that must keep you in constant contact with friends, family and co-workers. The hands-free cell phone law is still in effect! Is it worth risking the fine or becoming involved in an accident?

Cell Phones in Motor Vehicles

The use of wireless telephone or electronic communication device by an operator of a moving motor vehicle on a public road or highway shall be unlawful except when the telephone is a hands-free wireless telephone or the electronic communications device is used hands-free, provided that its placement does not interfere with the operation of federally required safety equipment and the operator exercises a high degree of caution in the operation of

The operator of a motor vehicle may use a hand-held wireless telephone while driving with on hand on the steering wheel only if:

- 1. The operator has reason to fear for his life or safety, or believes that a criminal act may be perpetrated against himself or another person; or
- 2. The operator is using the telephone to report to appropriate authorities a fire, a traffic accident, a serious road hazard or medical or hazardous materials emergency, or to report the operator of another motor vehicle who is driving in a reckless, careless or otherwise unsafe manner or who appears to be driving under the influence or alcohol or drugs.

If you are issued a summons for using a cell phone and you wish to plead not guilty utilizing the above as a defense, you may be required to produce a cell phone bill indicating the numbers that you called or written statements from authorities receiving such calls.

Obviously, text messaging on a cell phone while driving is prohibited under this motor vehicle statute.



#### **AN AMERICAN ICON: FRANK** SINATRA'S LEGACY

On Tuesday, November 25th, at noon, the Springfield Free Public Library will offer a musical lecture on Frank Sinatra, presented by Mel Glazer, songwriter and lecturer. This program looks at Frank Sinatra's singing style, technique, and legacy to illuminate what sets him apart from other popular singers of his era. Travel the streets of Hoboken in the 1920's, where Sinatra experienced the life of poverty and prejudice. Learn how he raised the standards of popular music, partly by bringing show music and all the famous names associated with it, to mainstream America. Hear how his reading of songs advanced the age-old discussion as to whether lyrics, in fact, are also

Songs that speaker Mel Glazer co-wrote have been recorded by Etta James, Robert Plant, Elvis Presley and Static-X, among others, and are represented in all the major media: movies, TV, off-Broadway and the cabaret circuit. Collaborators have included Carole King, Sammy Fain and Aaron Shroeder. A raconteur, Mr. Glazer's unique perspective on Frank Sinatra as a role model (both professionally and personally) gained international attention when Mr. G. was interviewed by Joe Franklin on Bloomberg's "Business of Show Business." We are fortunate to have him present this free lecture at the Springfield Free Public Library.

#### **UNDERSTANDING ISLAM**

With so much of our current political debate centering on struggles in the Middle East, it is perhaps the perfect time to gain knowledge of basic parts of that struggle which we might not understand. On Wednesday, November 5th, at 7:00 P.M., the Springfield Free Public Library will welcome Christopher Taylor, Ph.D. who will expand our horizons. With over 1.25 billion followers worldwide, Islam is today the world's second largest and fastest growing religion. Estimates of the number of American Muslims now range between 2.3 and over 6 million, making Islam an increasingly important presence on the landscape of American religious life. Nevertheless, many Americans still feel that they know very little, and understand even less, about Islam. This broad introduction will outline the major tenets of Islamic faith, discuss ritual practices of Islam, explore the aspects of Islamic spirituality, and explain the rich diversity defining this great religious tradition.

Dr. Taylor is a Professor of Religion and Director of the Middle East Studies Program at Drew University. Previous to his appointment there, he served for one year as the Acting Executive Director of the Center for Arabic Study Abroad at the American University in Cairo, and as Dean of Calhoun College and Instructor of Near Eastern Studies at Yale University. He is the author of a book and several articles and is currently working on a study about the social construction of moral imagination in the medieval Islamic world.
